


Bouna's Schoolbag

He makes mud into bricks and heads home when it is dark.




Bouna has to push the brick transport cart and move very heavy bricks everyday. This caused his hands to have many scars.

Even though the job is hard, Bouna still works hard. He hopes to earn more money for his family to buy food.




After getting home from work, Bouna still has to do chores and take care of siblings. It is really tiring!


Note:

Bouna hopes that he can wake up one day and be like other children: wearing his schoolbag and going to school.




Every night, Bouna holds the schoolbag that he brought home. Do you know why?

One day, the people of World Vision came to visit Bouna. Seeing that his schoolbag is unusable and knowing that he really wants to go to school, they decided to help him.




Note:
