(A) Thematic Talks

Objective : Through the sharing of World Vision staff and educational videos that depict stories of impoverished children living under challenging circumstances, students are given opportunities to see the world from a new perspective; reflect on their role in our world and develop a positive attitude to life.

Disaster Preparedness & Relief	Environment & Sustainable Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Objective: Help students understand how natural disasters affect the lives of the poor and the significance of disaster preparedness work. ▪ Content: By comparing the aftermaths of the earthquakes in Haiti and Japan, the talk discusses how relief works are carried out in developed and developing countries, how disasters disproportionately affect the poor and the importance of disaster preparedness in community development. 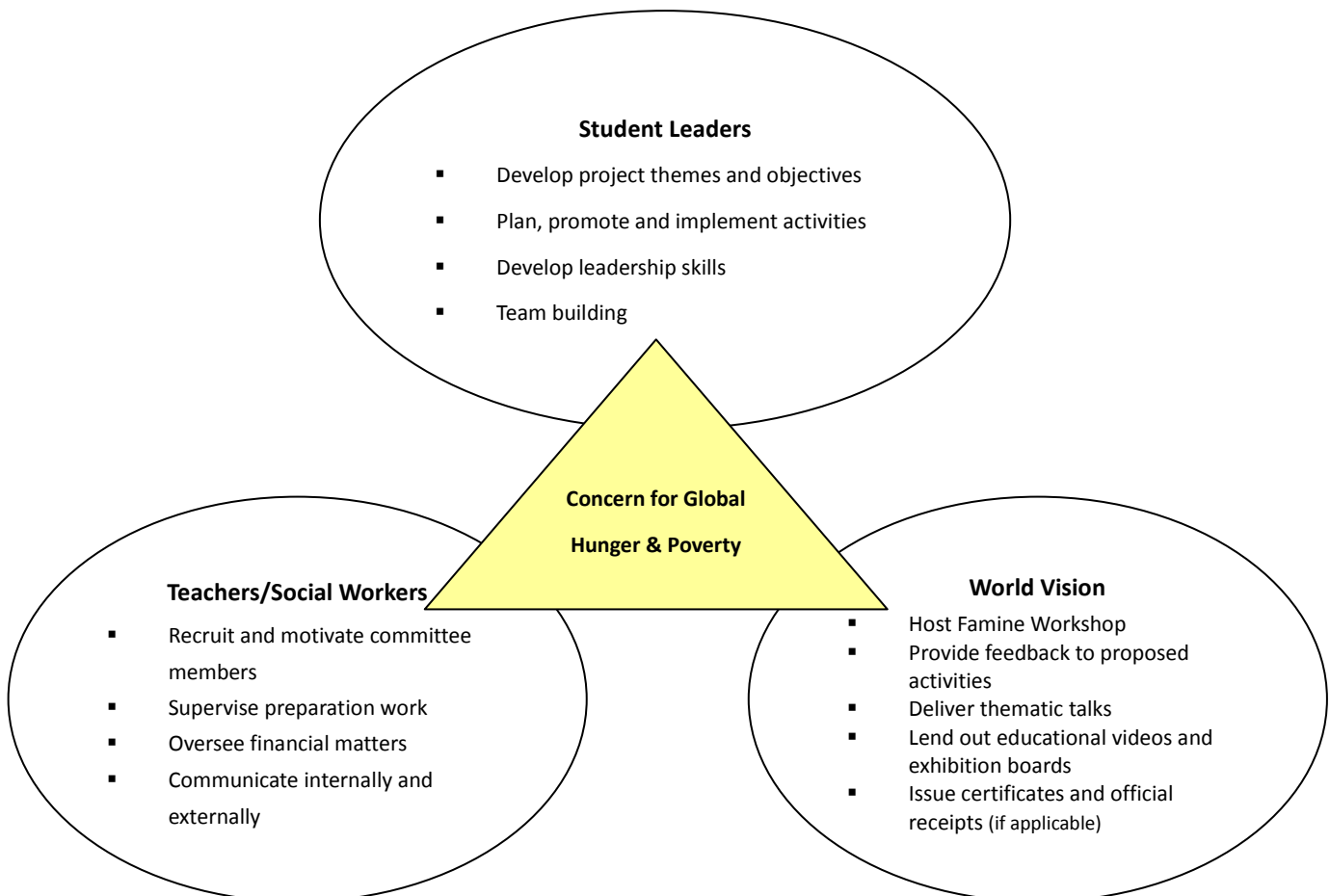
(B) “School Famine” & “Famine Workshop”

Content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Learn: Through participating in our thematic talks^A and watching educational videos^B, students will uncover the causes and impact of malnourishment and ways to alleviate such problems. ▪ Act: Using resources^C provided by World Vision, students can share about child malnourishment in developing countries with family and friends. ▪ Extended activities: Students spearhead school famine activities^{D,E} to help peers experience hunger and expose them to the issue of global food crisis. We encourage students to donate their money on food to help children in hunger through World Vision’s Food Security Programmes.
