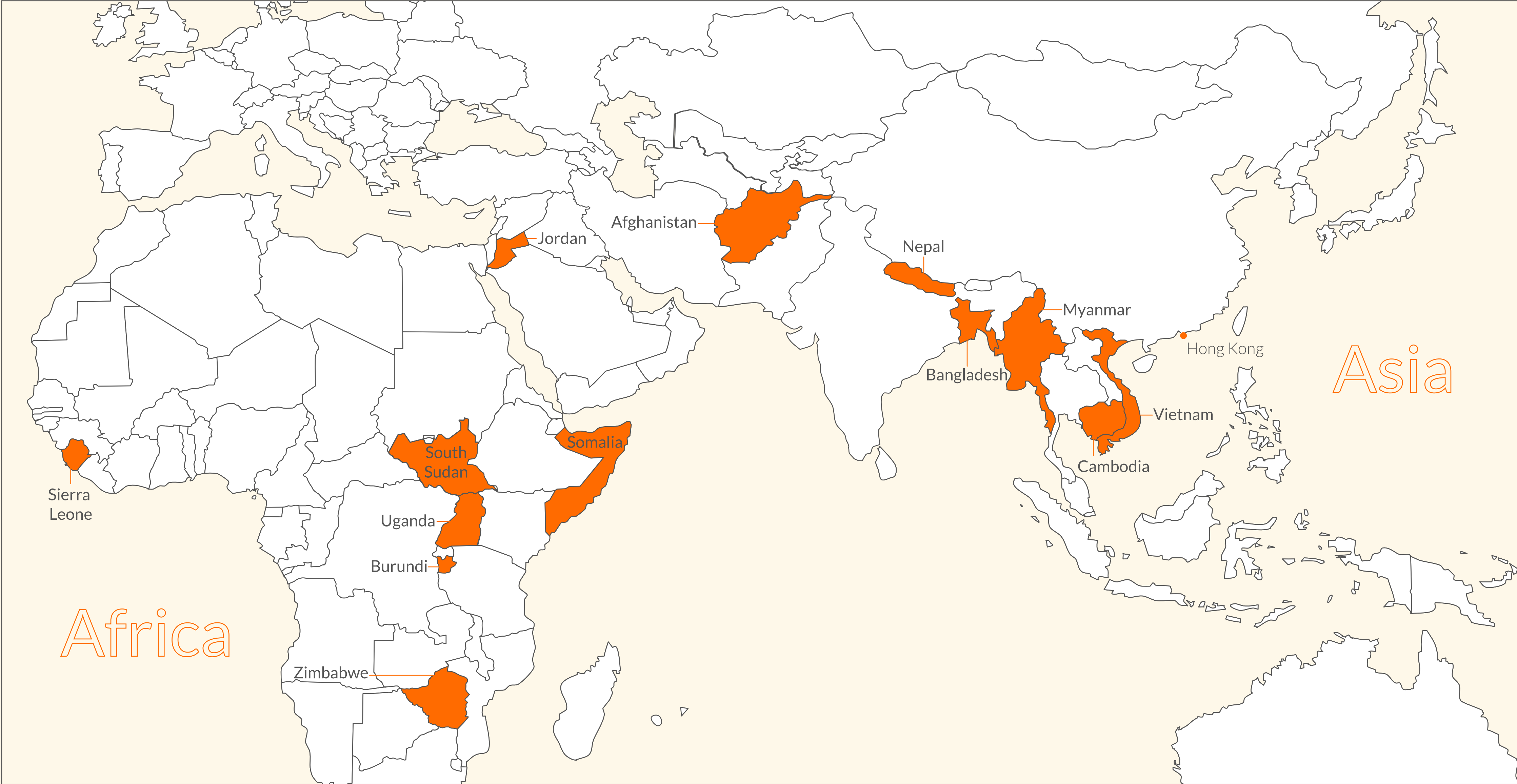

For Children

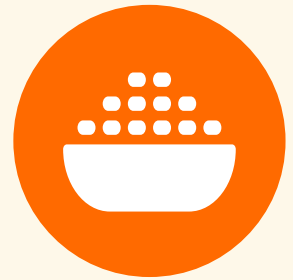


These gifts equip children with skills and resources to grow up healthy, safe and happy. We delivered:



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

- Menstrual hygiene kits and training for **505** girls



Health and Nutrition

- Mobile medical treatment for **19,086** acutely malnourished or sick children
- Nutritious food for **449** acutely malnourished children for 6 months



Child Protection

- Psychosocial support for **575** children affected by conflict
- A year's early childhood education for **2,177** internally displaced children



Education and Care

- Textbooks for **1,408** students
- Bicycles for **416** children living in remote areas to travel to school with ease
- Uniform and stationery for **354** out-of-school children to resume learning
- Non-formal education to help **68** street children prepare themselves to return to school

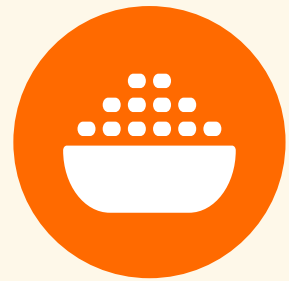
- Vocational training for **12** out-of-school adolescents



For Families



These gifts benefit the whole family by enabling wellness and sustainable sources of income. We delivered:



Health and Nutrition

- Cooking demonstration sessions for **126** people to ensure children have sufficient intake of nutrients



Livelihood

- Improved seeds for **300** impoverished households to increase harvest amidst climate change
- **533** goats, **364** cows, **316** pigs and **2,500** chickens or ducks for impoverished families
- Support for **139** people in poverty to start a grocery store or small business to diversify their income source
- Support for **75** women to attend gardening training



Local Programme

- Food packs for **41** grass-roots families in need in Hong Kong



Disaster Risk Reduction

- Emergency food aid for **6,645** people in need (in partnership with the World Food Programme)



For Communities



These gifts empower communities to enable people to thrive and become self-reliant. We delivered:



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

- Provision of **262** water filters for schools
- Building of **20** hand-washing stations for schools
- Support for the construction of **13** large-scale water facilities



Health and Nutrition

- Support for the operation of a mobile health team in remote areas for **20** months
- Medical equipment for health centres, benefiting **56,764** people in total
- Support for the building of a canteen in **21** schools



Education and Care

- Installation of **45** solar lights for schools
- Building of **8** classrooms for schools



Livelihood

- Construction of **1** fish pond in a school for vocational training

Empowered to Break Free from Poverty through Education

Living in a squatter community in Myanmar, 12-year-old Win Nwe was burdened by daily struggles as she scavenged for a living with her family. Money was tight, and educational resources for her were just as scarce.
