


Thanks to our donors, these gifts of hope have been sent to children and communities in 14 countries and city in 2023.





For Children



These gifts equip children with skills and resources to grow up healthy, safe and happy. We delivered:



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

- Menstrual hygiene kits and training for 505 girls



Health and Nutrition

- Mobile medical treatment for 19,086 acutely malnourished or sick children
- Nutritious food for 449 acutely malnourished children for 6 months



Child Protection

- Psychosocial support for 575 children affected by conflict
- A year's early childhood education for 2,177 internally displaced children



Education and Care

- Textbooks for 1,408 students
- Bicycles for 416 children living in remote areas to travel to school with ease
- Uniform and stationery for 354 out-of-school children to resume learning
- Non-formal education to help 68 street children prepare themselves to return to school

These gifts benefit the whole family by enabling wellness and sustainable sources of income. We delivered:



Health and Nutrition

- Cooking demonstration sessions for 126 people to ensure children have sufficient intake of nutrients



Local Programme

 Food packs for 41 grass-roots families in need in Hong Kong



Livelihood

- Improved seeds for 300 impoverished households to increase harvest amidst climate change
- 533 goats, 364 cows, 316 pigs and 2,500 chickens or ducks for impoverished families
- Support for 139 people in poverty to start a grocery store or small business to diversify their income source
- Support for 75 women to attend gardening training



Disaster Risk Reduction

• Emergency food aid for 6,645 people in need (in partnership with the World Food Programme)

These gifts empower communities to enable people to thrive and become self-reliant. We delivered:



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

- Provision of 262 water filters for schools
- Building of 20 hand-washing stations for schools
- Support for the construction of 13 large-scale water facilities



Health and Nutrition

- Support for the operation of a mobile health team in remote areas for 20 months
- Medical equipment for health centres, benefiting
 56,764 people in total
- Support for the building of a canteen in 21 schools

- Installation of 45 solar lights for schools
- Building of 8 classrooms for schools

Empowered to Break Free from Poverty through Education

Living in a squatter community in Myanmar, 12-year-old Win Nwe was burdened by daily struggles as she scavenged for a living with her family. Money was tight, and educational resources for her were just as scarce.

However, things started to improve when Win Nwe enrolled in World Vision's non-formal education program, which provides her and other impoverished children in the community with the opportunity to learn in a safe environment and break free from poverty through education. Timely Treatment to Help Young Lives Thrive

After being identified with acute malnutrition, Aniso in Somalia was immediately enrolled in an integrated health and nutrition project supported by World Vision and provided with ready-to-use therapeutic food and systematic treatment. Over the following five weeks, Aniso made tremendous improvement and was out of danger. She continued to receive treatment until she fully recovered.
