

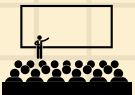

1. SEMINARS & /OR WORKSHOPS (60-90MINS)



To enable students to understand the challenges of children in poverty, deepen their awareness through immersive simulations, and inspire social action to foster responsibility.

Wartime Rescuers

Simulate the difficult choices faced by refugee families during their escape. This session helps students understand how war forces innocent civilians and children to lose their homes, loved ones, and future. It also encourages students to care about and respond to the needs of refugees.



#WAR AND PEACE

Climate Crisis

This session highlights the negative impacts of the climate crisis on developing countries, helping participants understand the challenges faced by children living in poverty and the importance of responding to climate change. It also encourages students to practice climate justice in their daily lives.



#CLIMATE CHANGE

Every Drop Counts

This session helps students understand the scarcity of water resources and how it affects impoverished communities. It emphasises that access to clean water is not to be taken for granted. It will also introduce World Vision's efforts in addressing water challenges and encourage students to respond through action, value clean water, and adopt a sustainable lifestyle.

2. SERVICE-LEARNING TRIP



Through visiting World Vision's area programmes across different countries, students will gain deeper insights into global poverty and hunger issues. This experience helps cultivate global citizenship and encourages reflection on personal lifestyle and values.

3. GLOBAL CITIZEN INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

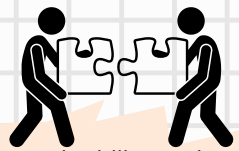


Our 8-week Summer Internship Programme runs every June to July, welcoming tertiary students to gain hands-on experience in various departments of World Vision Hong Kong. Interns will deepen their understanding of our mission while developing a strong sense of social responsibility. Weekly activities include online cultural exchanges with children from other countries, local volunteer service, and staff sharing sessions, allowing interns to learn about the experiences of people from diverse backgrounds and cultures.

5. OTHER ACTIVITY

Global 6K for Water

Globally, 703 million people lack access to basic drinking water facilities, forcing many women and girls to walk roughly six kilometers each day to fetch it. However, the water they collect is often unsafe, putting their health at serious risk.

To address this pressing issue, World Vision launched the Global 6K for Water, uniting people of all ages to run and raise funds for World Vision's water projects in Africa. First held in the U.S. in 2015, the event has since expanded to many countries and regions around the world.

Last year, the event debuted successfully in Hong Kong, where people of all ages ran together to raise funds supporting clean water projects in Africa.

This year, the Asia G6K tour kicked off in Malaysia, followed by Korea, Japan, and Singapore, with Hong Kong joining in December. Together, we are raising awareness about the global water crisis!

We encourage students to take practical action to bless those in need. Through fundraising activities like the ones below, they learn to spread love, bring warmth and hope to children and families in distant communities.

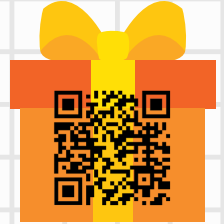

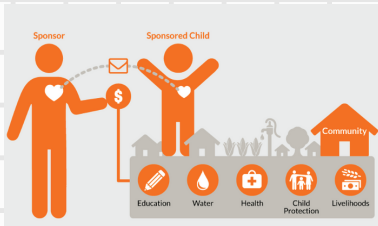
The gifts you select will support World Vision's five key development areas in impoverished communities: child care, education, economic livelihood, water and health, and community development.

Childhood Rescue is a flexible and fast-moving programme that adapts to meet the real needs of vulnerable children in real-time. Our projects include emergency response, water & sanitation, food & nutrition, child protection, livelihoods, and education. By providing various forms of humanitarian aid, we help the most vulnerable children in the world to meet their immediate needs, recover from their traumatic experiences, and reclaim hope for the future.

You may support Childhood Rescue now. Through a monthly donation of \$150 or more, you will support World Vision in providing various forms of assistance, enabling those who suffer to survive, recover and build a future.



- Registration for the 2025–2026 academic year is now open. Quotas are limited so early application is encouraged.
- Each faculty/ department/ society may apply for one free on-campus talk/activity per academic year.
- To encourage fundraising, an additional free on-campus talk/activity can be arranged for donations of HK\$1,000 or above.
- Schools are responsible for arranging the transportation of any borrowed workshop materials. Schools must also provide necessary equipment, including a computer, internet access, projector, and audio system.
